Ten Steps To Borrowing eBooks with your Kindle

What you will need to begin:

- ⌘ **Charged and registered Kindle device**
- ⌘ **Oceanside Library Card**
- ⌘ **Amazon ID & Password**
- ⌘ **Wi-Fi or Computer with USB Cable**



- 1). If you have a Kindle Fire, you may begin by connecting to a Wi-Fi network and opening your Kindle Fire's browser. For all other Kindles, you must begin on a computer. Go to the Oceanside Library website: www.oceansidelibrary.com.
- 2). Click on the [Nassau Digital Doorway](#) graphic on our homepage. This is where you will search for or browse and check out Kindle eBooks.
- 3). Click [Sign In](#) and choose Oceanside Library from the drop down menu. Enter your library barcode on the next screen.
- 4). Browse or search the collection to find a book. You can refine your search by choosing [Advanced Search](#) where you can set the [Format](#) drop down menu to [Kindle Books](#). You can also check the [Only show available copies](#) box.
- 5). When you find a title, click [on the book cover](#). Click [Borrow](#).
- 6). Drop down the Download menu, check [Kindle Book](#). Click [Confirm & Download](#).
- 7). You will be taken to the Amazon.com page, make sure you are signed into your Amazon account. Click [Get Library Book](#).
- 8). If you are using the Kindle Fire or another Wi-Fi enabled Kindle, skip to step 10. If you are downloading to the Kindle dx, or if you cannot access a WiFi connection, go to step 9.
- 9). For Kindle dx or WiFi connection issues: If your Kindle is not Wi-Fi capable or you do not have access to a Wi-Fi connection, read Amazon's instructions and watch the video about how to transfer files via USB by going to: <http://tinyurl.com/3hsnh52>
- 10). Once you have downloaded the eBook it should appear on your homepage in [Books](#). If it is not there, press your settings icon, then press the 'sync' button, the title should now appear.
