BUDGET MESSAGE FOR 2018 - 2019

I am pleased to report that this year's Library budget stays within the New York State tax cap, without diminishing any of the resources, programs or services we are providing the Oceanside community.

While I have only been the Director since September, my association with the Library goes back much further; indeed, I grew up in Oceanside, my family and I live here, and I have worked at the Library as a library trainee, librarian and now Director. I am proud of the work we do here, the dedication of our staff, and the support of our Board and community.

We have accomplished much these last several months, although some of what we have done consists of modernizing and making "back office" systems more efficient. Ours is a busy place. Last year saw over 250,000 patrons visit us and we hosted over 1,200 programs attended by over 36,000 people.
